## 4 Easy Steps to a Picture Perfect lawn:

- 1) Prepare the Soil: It's important there is good seed to soil contact. For small areas and spot seeding, work up the area with a hard rake to about 1/2" depth. Apply seed lightly.
- 2) Rake back in to about 1/4" deep so seed is barely below the surface.
- 3) Fertilize: Apply Dyna Green Starter fertilizer for optimum establishment and growth.
- 4) Water: Water thoroughly. Keep moist until grass germinates. Do not allow the top 1/2" of the soil to become dry. Once the lawn is established, reduce watering frequency to help ensure a deep rooted lawn.
